Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, ‘as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.’” (Hebrews 11:8-12)

The very essence of the Advent and Epiphany season is that God comes powerfully into our world still today. We can expect His coming afresh into the life and ministry of St. Timothy. When we allow Him to break us and rebuild us into a new and renewed force for Him, our finest days are ahead of us.
